"Love is Contagious" by Patricia McLain, is a delightful, romantic comedy made up of a cast of seven women and four men. As the story goes, Sally, a young farm girl from Kansas visits New York City with plans to become an actress or model. To her brother Robbie's surprise, she arrives at his Greenwich Village apartment and announces that she is staying with him and his roommate. Robbie, a newspaper reporter, and his roommate Sam, an artist, are not happy about her arrival because she "mothers" them and adds feminine touches to their apartment. She also plays matchmaker by reuniting them with their former girlfriends. Filled with tense moments, light-hearted laughs and a cast of colorful characters, the merriment never slackens. True love, as it should, triumphs in the end. The diverse cast also includes the landlady who keeps talking about her three dead husbands, the nosey spinster next door, a boisterous cab driver, a gambler, a French model, and a "plain Jane" neighbor who finds inner beauty and true love.

"Love is Contagious" will be staged by Gail Possley, director of PACT's 2004 comedy, "Arsenic and Old Lace." You won't want to miss the show and learn why "Love IS Contagious!"

Cast of Characters

Sally Winters – Fresh off the farm in Kansas, Sally is naturally pretty with a completely wholesome quality about her. She is inquisitive, talkative, stubborn, maternal, and completely lovable. She is Robbie's sister. Sally is twenty one years old.

Sam Harway – Twenty-eight years old, handsome, moody, a little vain, and a lady's man. He is Robbie's roommate and an artist with a rather sarcastic hard shell, but in spite of himself, is quite personable.

Robbie Winters – Middle to late twenties. Robbie is Sally's brother. He works as a newspaper reporter who has lived in New York City for five years. He loves his work, but finds it difficult to mix work with his love life. He is a regular sort of a guy – nice looking and easy going.

Diane Roberts – Diane is in her middle twenties, rather attractive, and very career and social-minded. Sometimes aloof, always well dressed and has a definite air of class and sophistication about her, Diane is confused about her career aspirations and her desire to marry Robbie.

Mrs. Kayser – A widow in her fifties or sixties. She's the landlady. She is portly, jovial, and undereducated. She is always concerned about the rent and additional boarders. She likes to talk about her three dead husbands.

Guy Ketchen – Guy is a hack cab driver who charges interest on unpaid cab bills. He is loud and outspoken. His biggest problem is his women.

Miss Lerner – A spinster who lives next door, Miss Lerner is a middle-aged "busy-body" that comes borrowing to see what's going on. She is tall and skinny and wears her glasses down on her nose.

Harry Turner – In his early thirties, Harry is a horse player who always loses, and when he loses, he drinks. He earns money by doing odd jobs and stays with the guys when he's broke.

Mimi Lamarr – Mimi is in her twenties. She's a French model. She is very attractive with a model's figure. Her admirers keep her in fur.

Georgia Rutherford – Georgia lives down the hall. In her late twenties and modestly attractive, she wears old-fashioned glasses and her hair in a bun. She works in a book store. She is from Georgia and has a southern accent.

Kitty Gauge – Kitty is a chorus girl - a bleached blonde with a voluptuous figure and "the shapeliest legs this side of the Mississippi." She has a Brooklyn accent and chews gum constantly. She is not to be classified as a "lady."

Females auditioning for the roles of Sally, Diane, Kitty, Mimi and Georgia may range in age from sixteen to late twenties. Males auditioning for the roles of Robbie, Sam and Harry may range in age from eighteen to thirty. Guy may be any age. Mrs. Keyser and Miss Lerner may be from fifty to seventy years old.
